FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

**I have declared my major as Pre-Elementary Education but would like to change to Pre- Elementary Bilingual Education - how can I switch?**

You may change your major by visiting MySCSU → Records → Select change program or degree. Please know that changing your major during the 4 weeks of advising (approx. midterm) may impact the way you and your advisor negotiate your planned program. In other words, if you attend an advising session, plan your program for your program and then change programs, you will need to recreate a planned program.

**Why do I have two majors as a Pre-EDU student, e.g. Collaborative and Liberal Studies (LBS).**

As an Education student in one of our four programs, you will learn about pedagogy, educational theories and their implications, methodologies, and effective practices for *all* learners. Additionally, you will engage with a deeper study of the world in which we live through the social sciences (history and psychology) and humanities (languages and literacies). A significant portion of any early childhood and elementary education curricula is dedicated to language, literacy development and an exploration of communities, both historically and present day. You may have noticed that each education major has a pre-assigned corresponding Liberal Studies major that is divided into two concentrations, essentially minors.

**Can I change my LBS major to a different area of study than that of the pre-selected concentration?**

These areas of study have been chosen based upon the funds of knowledge that both school curricula and SCSU faculty privilege and believe apprenticing teachers should cultivate in order to become highly effective. For students in the Elementary Education or Collaborative Programs, you may swap out the history concentration with any of the following 12 *pre-approved* concentrations: Biology, Chemistry, Earth Science, Social Science, Environmental Studies, Geography, Math, Physics, Political Science, Anthropology, Sociology and Economics. Considerable thought has been dedicated to the creation of LBS concentrations. They have been chosen with your best interests in mind so that, together, we can explore ways you can provide the highest levels of instruction to future students. Please note that swapping out History for another concentration will directly influence your shared three, ie. you may have to take one or two additional courses.

## When and how do I go about applying to my program of choice within the Department of Curriculum & Learning?

In order to apply to your program – change from a Pre-Education student to an Education student – you must have completed all four prerequisite courses: EDU 206 for Early Childhood majors and EDU 200 for all other Pre-education students, ENG 112, SED 225 or SED 481, and MAT 105. All applicants must have completed these course before applying to the Program.

## What else do I need to complete my application to the Education program of my choice?

Please refer to the document titled “[C&L Application Checklist](#),” for more information. You will need to create a free TK20 account at [tk20.southernct.edu](http://tk20.southernct.edu). You will have to give some thought to two people who can serve as your recommenders: preferably one who can speak to your academic strengths (former professor/teacher), and one who can attest to your professional strengths working with children (former or current supervisor/mentor). You will list each recommender on Tk20. Subsequently, they will receive instructions to complete a form and a letter. Both items are part of the recommendation and must be returned to our office in Davis or uploaded via TK20. Another significant feature of your application will be your essay. Again, please refer to the C&L Application Checklist and TK20 for further details.

## For Elementary and Collaborative (Special Ed/Elem) majors only: How can I request a change from my HIS concentration to one of the 12 pre-approved concentrations (Biology, Chemistry, Earth Science, Environmental Studies, Geography, Mathematics, Physics, Political Science, *Social Science, Sociology, Economics, Anthropology*)?

5. Then Select to change your MAJOR.
6. Select “this is to replace my previous degree Program”:

  - a. Liberal Studies, ENTER NAME OF CONCENTRATION you are changing
  - b. Select that your new major is “Liberal Studies, B.S. (second major for Education students)”
  - c. Then select the TWO concentrations you want (NOTE: discuss acceptable concentrations with your advisor).
