Subj: Invitation to Apply for Faculty Creative Activity Research Grants for FY 2020-21

On behalf of the Faculty Senate, I am very pleased to announce the continuation of the Faculty Creative Activity Research Grant (FCARG) Program, a funding resource that supports faculty creative activity. You are hereby invited to submit an application for funding for **Fiscal Year July 1, 2020, to June 31, 2021.** This research grant program was created as a result of Faculty Senate Resolution S.10.3.

The FCARG application process is modeled on the CSU-AAUP grant application process. Applications are individually reviewed and judged based on merit. All tenure-track and tenured faculty are eligible and encouraged to apply.

## **Details:**

- The grant award is standardized as a \$2,500 stipend; accordingly, applications are not to include a budget.
- Individual and joint applications are welcome, however joint awardees split the stipend.
- Seven copies of the completed application must be submitted to the Office of Faculty Development (Buley Library, Room 216).
- The deadline for submission of an application is 4:00 PM, Wednesday, October 2, 2019.
- Applications will be reviewed by the University Grants Committee, which will send recommendations to the Office of the Provost by 4:00 PM on **Monday, November 11, 2019.**
- Grant awards will be announced by the Office of the Provost by Monday, December 2, 2019.
