

BS: COMMUNICATION DISORDERS FALL 2023

FIRST YEAR COURSE SELECTION

1st Year, 2nd Semester Course Selection:

Majors SHOULD take the following courses (if not already taken):

- T1WC: English 112: Writing Arguments (ENG 120 if they have taken ENG 119)
 - *To take introductory CMD courses, students must earn a B or higher in ENG 112/120.*
 - If students are registered for ENG 112 their first semester should take CMD 200 in their second semester.
- Math in sequence to T1QR: MAT 107

Remaining courses: Students should take LEP Tier 1 and Tier 2 courses. It is highly recommended they take one of the science requirements this semester. **CMD 150** is not a required course, but it is a suggested elective to reach 120 credits. It is capped at 14 seats.

Majors can take the following course if it fits into their schedule:

- PSY 100 – Intro to Psychology (this is not required, but it is strongly encouraged and is a T2MB optional course and will fulfill a cognate requirement)

Important Advising Information:

LEP T1/T2 Restricted Courses/Recommended Courses: These courses will be shared with the major or cognate.

- T1QR: MAT 107-Elementary Statistics
- T2PR: Options: CHE 103, 120; PHY 100, 101, 200, 201, 230
- T2LE: Options: BIO 100, 104, 120, 200

Math Requirement Information:

- Math sequence to MAT 107: MAT 100/100p, MAT 107

Cognates:

Two courses in the social/behavioral sciences in psychology, sociology, anthropology, or public health (courses used to satisfy the Liberal Education Program may be used to satisfy this requirement). PSY 100 would fill this requirement.

GPA Requirement:

- All CMD majors are required to maintain both an overall and departmental 3.0 GPA. Students who do not maintain this GPA will no longer be considered as CMD majors and will not be able to register for classes in the major. Students who have registered for CMD courses in an upcoming semester will be required to drop those courses if they fail to achieve the required 3.0 GPA in the previous semester.
