

BA: ENGLISH AND BS: ENGLISH 7-12

CATALOG TERM FALL 2022 FIRST YEAR COURSE SELECTION

1st Year, 2nd Semester Course Selection:

Majors SHOULD take the following courses (if not already taken):

- T1WC ENG 112: Writing Arguments (ENG 120 if currently enrolled in ENG 119)
- Take an ENG course within LEP Tier 2: consider taking ENG 217, 218, or 219
- If English 7-12: Consider ENG 217 or ENG 219 **and** either HIS 100 or HIS 111
- Students can take a math towards T1QR: MAT 103 Math for Liberal Arts (recommended)
- Remaining courses: Students should take LEP Tier 1 and Tier 2 courses.

Important Advising Information:

Academic Maps: Students should consult the Academic Maps for the timing of English courses. It is recommended that students take English 307 in the first semester of their sophomore year.

LEP T1/T2 Courses:

- T1AE: HIS 110 or HIS 1
- 11 (if English 7-12 major)
- T2MB: SHE 203 (if English 7-12 major)
- T2CC: EDU 200 (if English 7-12 major)

Majors in the English 7-12 education program:

- Students should plan to take EDU 200 the first semester of their sophomore year.
- Students can learn about the application process on the English Secondary Education Website <https://inside.southernct.edu/english/secondary-education-bs> or on the School of Education website.

Math Requirement Information:

- This major does not have a specific T1QR requirement. MAT 103 Math is recommended. If student is already taking a different math course towards T1QR, they don't need to take MAT 103. Math sequence to MAT 103: MAT 100/100p then MAT 103

Minimum GPA and Grades:

- All majors are required to have a 2.7 major GPA.
- Students must earn minimum grade of a "C" in all major courses.
- 7-12 students: Student must earn a 3.0 in English major courses and a Cumulative GPA of 2.7 to apply to **and remain** in the education program.

Credits:

- No more than 1/3 of credits in the ENG major may be transfer credits.
