CATALOG TERM FALL 2022 FIRST YEAR COURSE SELECTION.

1st Year, 2nd Semester Course Selection:

Should take the following courses (if not already taken):

- T1WC: Written Communication - ENG 112: Writing Arguments
 - Take ENG 120 if they are taking ENG 119 for bilingual students
- Math Sequence –Math requirements vary greatly depending academic major. If a student is Exploratory Business, Arts and Humanities, or Social and Behavioral Sciences and they are certain that they are only exploring majors within those specific areas respectively, they can take their next level of math as outlined below.
- Next 2-3 classes can be from Tier 1 and/or Tier 2

Important Advising Information:

LEP Recommended/Restricted Courses:

- If a student is interested in a specific major, it would be helpful to make sure they can do a “What if” for that major and review any recommended courses within Tier 1 and 2 (formerly known as restrictions). These courses could give the student experience with major courses while also making progress toward gen eds.
- Students can only take two courses from a single discipline subject area in Tier 2.

Math Requirement Information: Math is only recommended to students with the below concentrations who are CERTAIN that they are only exploring majors within their academic concentrations.

- Arts and Humanities Concentration: Math sequence to MAT 103/MAT 104: MAT 100/100p (if required by placement) and then MAT 103/MAT104
- Business Concentration: Math sequence to MAT 120: MAT 100/100p, MAT 112, MAT 120
- Social and Behavioral Science Concentration: Math sequence to MAT 103/MAT 104: MAT 100/100p (if required by placement) and then MAT 103/MAT104

Other important information here:

- Students who have major interest in many different subjects or are not sure about major options at all should be strongly encouraged to do the Major Exploration Tool to review all the academic options and narrow down their list of majors.
