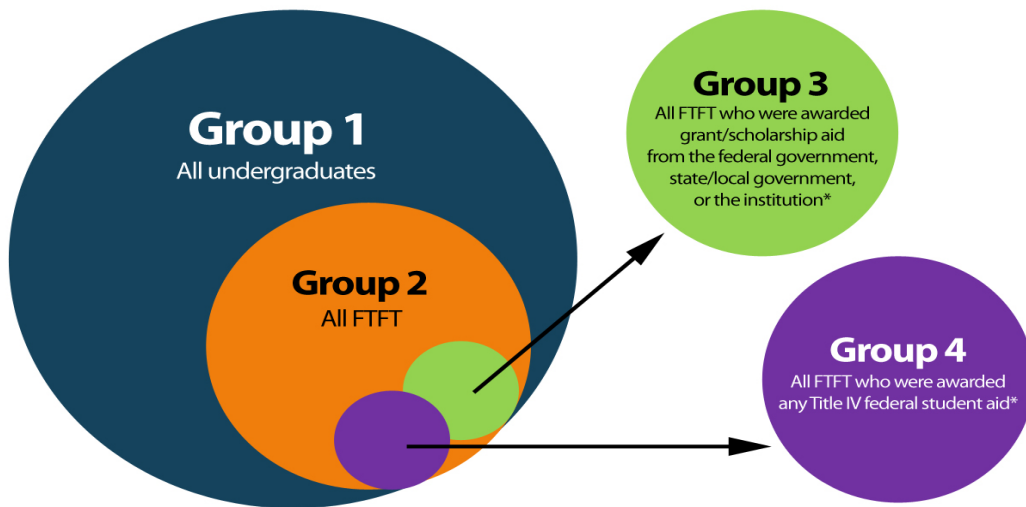

COA Revisions

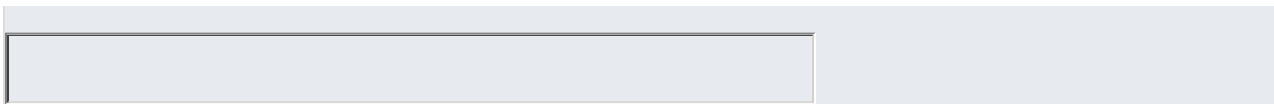
