Message from the Director of Orientation, Transition & Family Engagement

Dear Parents and Families!

Happy November! We are in the 10th week of the semester and soon we will be taking a break for Thanksgiving, heading into finals and closing out a great Fall semester. For the next few weeks, we will be focusing on the ways a student can tend to their academics as well as prepare for next semester.

Mid-Term Grades- For many students, this is an incredibly important point in the semester. Mid-term grades have been posted. Students can access their mid-term grades via Bannerweb

(https://inside.southernct.edu/advising/resources/videos). Please know that mid-term grades are NOT calculated in any way in a student's final grade. They should consider their mid-term grade as a benchmark, or snapshot, of their academic progress thus far in the semester. If a student has questions about their mid-term grade, they should connect with their professor. As students evaluate their performance, they could utilize several resources in developing a plan in pursuing their academic goals. In addition to connecting with their professors, they could seek academic support for both the content of their courses and guidance in improving their overall skills as a college student at the Center of Academic Success and Accessibility Services (https://inside.southernct.edu/casas). If a student determines that they may not be successful in a course, they can withdraw from a course before Sunday, November 20th (https://inside.southernct.edu/onestop/withdrawal). Please encourage your students to connect with their advisor if they are considering withdrawing from a course.

Course Registration for the Spring 2023- Seniors began registering for the Spring 2023 courses today! Below, you will see an email from the Registrar's office discussing the process, dates and instructions sent to students regarding course registration. All undergraduate students are required to meet with their advisor in order to register for their Spring courses. Please encourage your students to connect with their advisors as soon as possible. Naturally, an advisor's schedule will fill quickly as student's procrastinate and delay and try to meet closer to their registration date instead of doing so well in advance.

First-Generation Day- Lastly, November 8th is National First-Gen Day. Southern has an incredibly high number of students who will be the first in their families to graduate from college. We recognize and celebrate our firstgeneration students! As part of First-Gen Day, we are holding celebration next Tuesday, November 8th (see

information below). We also want to recognize the families of these incredible students who are here making you all proud! On November 8th, consider reaching out to your first-gen student and let them know just how proud you are!

Hi Owls,

To help you prepare for the upcoming Spring 2023 advising and registration season we have prepared this guide. For many of you, this will be first time you are registering for classes in the new system. Be sure to <u>Plan Your Schedule</u> in advance as described below, so you can register for classes with ease on your registration day.

Visit the **Registration Checklist** in advance to help you prepare for registration:

- Plan your schedule
- Find out how to obtain a pin
- Look up your registration date and time
- Check your holds

Find your Registration Date (verify your time here) based on the registration calendar:

- Graduates and Post-baccalaureate student registration opens on October 31, 2022
- Seniors student registration opens on November 1, 2022
- Juniors student registration opens on November 7, 2022
- Sophomores student registration opens on November 9, 2022
- Continuing Freshmen student registration opens on November 14, 2022

Do not delay in scheduling an Academic Advising appointment for undergraduate students:

Academic advising procedures differ depending on your major and class, ranging from group advising sessions to individual meetings with your assigned advisor. You will receive an email from your major department or advisor explaining their procedure.

- If you are a freshman in your first semester (regardless of major), you will meet individually with your INQ instructor for course registration advising and to receive your registration PIN number.
- If you are a second-semester freshman, sophomore, junior or senior, you should follow the academic advising procedure detailed by major department or assigned advisor for course registration advising and to receive your registration PIN number.
- If you have been not contacted by your advisor/department, please contact your advisor or the department chairperson for your major directly (*Who is my advisor?*).

- Select Banner Student
- Records and Registration

- Registration and Schedule Planner
- Select the Term
- Add Courses
- Add Breaks (times you can't attend classes due to other obligations)

Once your registration date and time arrives, you can return to your planner and click 'Register' to complete your registration.

Note: When creating a schedule plan, also save a backup schedule I your favorites in case seats are no longer available in your first choice.

Information Regarding Thanksgiving Break Residence Halls Closing

The Residence Halls will be closing for Thanksgiving break at 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 22, 2022.

We understand that students may have class after 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 22, 2022; if you have class, you have until 11:00 p.m. on November 22nd to check out of your residence hall. If you need until 11:00

p.m. to vacate your hall because of class or extenuating circumstances, please email your residence hall director by Friday, November 18th at 4:30 p.m. Please include your name, ID #, room, and the reason for your request to stay beyond 5:00 p.m. Upon closing, students will not be permitted in the building unless they have notified their hall director in advance.

The residence halls will re-open on Sunday, November 27, 2022 at 2:00 p.m.

The Office of Residence Life offers the option to remain on campus during Thanksgiving Break for students who have extenuating circumstances and are not able to return home for the holiday. We can also accommodate students who need to return early on Sunday (prior to 2:00 p.m. when the residence halls reopen) due to travel conflicts.

Please see below for the available break housing options:

Entire Break: Tuesday through Sunday (the fee for this option is \$192.50)

Return Early: Sunday between 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. (the fee for this option is \$38.50)

You must complete the Thanksgiving Break Housing Application. To reach the application:

- Log in to your Banner Student account.
- Select "Student Services"
- Click "MyHousing"
- "Proceed to MyHousing Portal"
- Next to the Residence Life logo in the top lefthand corner, click on the three lines
- Select "Applications"
- Click "Thanksgiving Break Housing Request"

Please note: there is a fee of \$38.50/night for Thanksgiving break housing. The deadline to request to stay during break is noon on Friday, November 18, 2022.

Your Residence Hall Director and Resident Advisors will be going through your room/apartment to make sure that it has been closed properly and that you have followed all closing procedures. If you wish to report a maintenance issue, fill out the <u>online form</u>. You may also utilize the maintenance request cards located at your hall's front desk.

Please do the following to prepare your room for Thanksgiving break:

- Take home any valuables or anything that you will need during Thanksgiving break. Please understand that housing and facilities staff may enter rooms to complete work orders.
- Clean your room and take any garbage to the dumpsters adjacent to your residence hall.
- Remove and discard any perishable items from your refrigerator that might spoil during Thanksgiving break.
- Lock your windows and close your curtains/blinds.
- Unplug everything within your room except fish tanks, your cable modem, and your refrigerator.
- Make sure your room door is closed and locked.

A note about packages:

Please note that packages delivered during the break period will be held at Facilities until the week following the break. If you need to receive items during the break, please ensure that you update your delivery address to your break address/location. We also recommend pausing or delaying deliveries until after the break, if possible.

Information Regarding Housing for the Spring Semester

We hope your fall semester is going well. We wanted to let you know that you can now pay the housing deposit and apply to housing for the Spring 2023 academic semester. This is a great opportunity to live on campus for a semester and take advantage of all the amazing things we have to offer (especially during the cold winter months ahead)!

How to apply and pay your deposit:

- Log on to your MySCSU
- Click on Banner Student
- Select MyHousing
- Next to the Residence Life logo on the top left click on the three lines
- Click "Applications"
- Click on "Housing Application and Deposit"
- Complete the application and pay the \$250 non-refundable housing deposit

Important information you need to know:

- The \$250.00 housing deposit is non-refundable.
- The deposit must be paid online with a credit card through the MyHousing Portal.
- You must pay your deposit by the November 3rd deadline to be eligible to participate in room selection.
- Upon submission of the housing deposit, you will have until November 30, 2022 to cancel your contract.
- After November 30, 2022, you are financially bound to the terms and conditions of the housing contract for the entire academic year (spring semester) and the housing contract cannot be cancelled to reside off campus during the contract term.

Your \$250.00 non-refundable housing deposit for the 2023 spring semester is due at the time of application. Please be aware that by paying your \$250.00 non-refundable housing deposit, you are agreeing to the terms of the academic year housing agreement (contract).
