


How do I know if I have excess credits that will impact my financial aid?

- ❓ Once in your Degree Eval, scroll down just below the "Electives" section. If you have courses (previous or current) that might not be covered for Financial Aid, they will appear in the "Excess" section just below Electives. If you do not see an Excess section, that means all courses are covered by financial aid. Excess courses from a previous semester will not impact your current or upcoming semester's financial aid.
