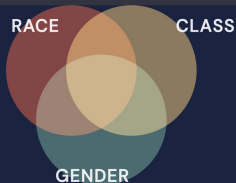

A Multi-Lens Approach to Understanding Society

SOC 529 examines the complex interplay of race, class, and gender through a wide range of theoretical perspectives. Students will critically investigate how these systems of power and identity intersect — and how that interrelationship shapes the experiences, opportunities, and social positions of individuals across different communities.



Critical Theory

Engage diverse frameworks for analyzing systems of inequality and power.



Social Location

Understand how overlapping identities shape access to resources and recognition.



Justice in Practice

Connect theory to real-world movements for equity and structural change.
