

Hints for Selecting 2nd Semester Courses: HONORS Program Students

Your second semester schedule will likely include mainly HONORS courses as well as either of the two LEP requirements you have yet to finish (quantitative reasoning and multilingual communication). In addition, your INQ instructor will work with you to determine any major courses that you should take next semester (this will vary depending on majors – some majors will not have students taking major courses in the first-year; others will. Your INQ instructor has all this information). It is recommended that you take 15 credits per semester in order to reach the 120 credits needed for graduation in four years.

1. The HONORS Program suggests you take the following courses in your 2nd semester:
 - a. HON 102 (1credit)
 - b. HON 200 (2 credits)
 - c. HON 201 (1 credit)
 - d. An additional section of HON 200 (2 credits)
2. For your remaining 9 credits, the following is recommended:
 - a. Complete the Quantitative Reasoning requirement on your degree evaluation if you have not. OR take any of the pre-requisites you still need in order to take your QR requirement (see math pathways chart)
 - b. Complete your Multilingual Communication requirement OR continue with pre-requisite courses needed in order to take your ML requirement OR talk to your INQ instructor about taking the STAMP exam to waive your ML requirement and earn 9-credits! *Any student interested in pursuing a major in a language, should contact Dr. Resha Cardone, chairperson of the World Language department.*
 - c. Take any major courses expected in the second-semester (your INQ instructor will help you determine this)
3. If the above recommendations do not get you to 15-credits, then fill that space with an elective or speak further with your INQ instructor about pursuing a minor
