- Assist with the development and facilitation of LGBTQ+ inclusivity trainings and other training exercises for student, faculty, and staff groups.
- Oversee the general daily operation of the SAGE Center.
- Manage the collection, organization, and upkeep of donations for the Open Door Closet.
- Manage the planning and promotion of large-scale events including Transgender Day of Remembrance and Lavender Graduation.
- Provide support for SAGE Center students to encourage their social, emotional, and academic success.
- Assist Prism in the planning and implementation of educational programs, activities, and special events designed to affirm and empower the LGBTQ+ campus community.
- Research current trends and best practices related to LGBTQ+ student support.
- Manage the SAGE Center Instagram page @scsusage, including posting program flyers, responding to messages, and connecting with other University social media accounts.
- Assist in the selection, training, and supervision of student workers.
- Work with the Associate Director on the creation of a university-wide advisory board comprised of students, faculty, and staff to discuss LGBTQ+ issues.
